

# THE DIOCESE OF ARIZONA RECEIVES 2021 UTO GRANT COMMUNITY DRIVEN STREAMING AND DIGITAL MINISTRY IN THE TIME OF COVID-19

On October 12, 2020, our United Thank Offering (UTO) Grant Application team found out that we had been awarded funds for our UTO grant proposal submitted in August! To say that we were honored, overwhelmed and thrilled is an understatement; many of us cried with happy and grateful tears, some of us couldn't believe that our grant request had been funded because the UTO Board receives about two times as many grant requests as they have money to fund. Others were relieved that we now had a funding source for a digital option to help us support our congregations during the continuing pandemic. It had been a long, hard process to get the UTO loan application completed – especially this summer while COVID-19 was ravaging Arizona – so here's a little bit of our story.

In late June, when the newly formed St. James Digital Ministry Team first decided to apply for UTO grant funds with a grant focus of Recovering with Love and Gratitude: An Episcopal Response to the COVID-19 Pandemic in Local Contexts, we looked at it as a request for streaming equipment just for St. James (Tempe) to use once we could get back into our sanctuary. We felt that many of our parishioners would not be comfortable attending in-person services. We considered the diocesan connections of one of our Digital Ministry Team members, Rev. Dr. Robin Hollis, and thought, why not bring in more congregations into the grant request? Wouldn't the Lord want us to "Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also

to the interests of others"? Philippians 2:4. So, after encouragement and support from Bishop Reddall, we increased our scope from one participating congregation to the final 13 participating congregations (see list below).

Going forward, our project goals are to: 1) sustain parishes through COVID-19 and beyond, 2) continue to provide weekly services and more to a community that is unable to attend in-person gatherings, and 3) provide services online, even after churches reopen for in-person gatherings, for those who are not able to, or may not feel comfortable to attend, due to health considerations. Success will be measured by number of views, clicks and attendance at online services, events and programs. The ultimate measure of success will be the continued existence of our parishes during and beyond COVID-19.

What has been so wonderful about the whole process so far is the incredible collaboration between the 13

congregations – from the application process to the implementation process. The Lord is definitely at work as we move ahead with this effort. At the time this article was written, we're in the process of meeting with the entire team, requesting/receiving UTO grant funds, ordering streaming equipment, piloting and testing equipment and preparing all 13 congregations for their streaming installation. Once we have installations in place, we'll share best practices and installation photos.
